



Is this you?

Mostly, you enjoy parenting, but you wish you knew how to deal with specific problem behaviour. Maybe your child won't go to bed without a fight. Perhaps they have a meltdown or tantrum almost every time you shop. They may be constantly disobedient, or they bite, fight or hit. If your child fits any of these descriptions, Triple P Discussion Groups can help.

What are Triple P Discussion Groups?

Triple P Discussion Groups are short, small group sessions that offer practical advice for tackling specific problem behaviour. The workshops will be run by Newton Primary School Psychologist, Mrs Michelle Babich. Each session brings together parents who are experiencing the same parenting problem, and covers one of the four topics listed below. Just choose which one (or however many) of the discussion group sessions fit your needs:

<i>Dealing with disobedience</i>	<i>Term 2</i>	<i>20th June</i>
<i>Developing good bedtime routines</i>	<i>Term 3</i>	<i>8th August</i>
<i>Managing fighting and aggression</i>	<i>Term 4</i>	<i>24th October</i>

What happens at a discussion group?

In a relaxed group session, Michelle will give you tips and suggestions for dealing with your child's problem behaviour. You'll see short video clips showing other parents successfully dealing with the same issue, and you'll be encouraged to share your thoughts with the other parents in the group. You'll also be given a take-home workbook with simple exercises and information to help you try your new strategies at home.

How long do the sessions take, and how many do I attend?

A Triple P Discussion Group session takes two hours and will run from 9.00 – 11.00am in the meeting room at The Play Factory, Santich Park, 19 Beckett Close, Munster. You may do as many or as few as you like. One, two or three – it's up to you. You'll be surprised at how a few small changes can make big differences!

Details for the first group, to be held in Term 2, are below:

Discussion Group 1 – Dealing with Disobedience

Topics include: examples of common forms of disobedience, why they occur and positive strategies to develop plans to prevent and manage disobedience when necessary.

Used lead acid batteries contain materials which if not handled correctly are harmful to humans, domestic pets, wildlife and the local environment.
What happens to the returned batteries?
Returned batteries are delivered to specialist recycling and reprocessing centres. Components metal, acids and plastics are reclaimed, recycled and put back into the manufacturing process to build more batteries and household products. This helps reduce the impact on natural resources and protect the environment for future generations.


